

# Investing for Success

**\$24,719\***

## This funding will be used to

1. Increase the percentage of students at Vale View State School achieving Darling Downs South West (DDSW) benchmarks in literacy and numeracy.
  - Measure: standardised assessment data
2. Allow teachers time off class to effectively collect and analyse reading data.
  - Measure: standardised reading assessment

## Our initiatives include

1. Providing individual and small group targeted instruction in literacy and numeracy in P-2.
  - Evidence: *Wheldall and colleagues (2017) demonstrated large gains in literacy performance for successive cohorts of children between 2005-2011 that received MiniLit, a program of structured reading instruction for small groups of disadvantaged children at risk of reading failure.*
2. Allowing teachers time off class to complete reading assessment one-on-one with students and to analyse reading data. Prep to Year 2 will complete them once a term and Yr 3 to 6 will complete them once a semester.

## Our school will improve student outcomes by

Action	Cost
Employing a teacher aide to implement literacy and numeracy programs under the guidance of our STLaN to support students experiencing learning difficulties (15 hrs teacher aide per week). In particular we will target intervention in the P-2 years.	\$18 191
Purchasing teacher release time to enable completion of one-one running reading assessment with individual students (14 days teacher release)	\$6 528
